SCRIPTURES

Jeremiah 23:1-6

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD.

23:2

Therefore thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the LORD.

23:3

Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. 23:4

I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall no longer fear or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the LORD.

23:5

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.

23:6

In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: "The LORD is our righteousness."

Colossians 1:11-20

May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, so that you may have all endurance and patience, joyfully

1:12

giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light.

1:13

He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son,

1:14

in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

1:15

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation,

1:16

for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers--all things have been created through him and for him.

1:17

He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

1:18

He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything.

1:19

For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, 1:20

and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Luke 1:68-79

"Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.

1:69

He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his child David,

1:70

as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,

1:71

that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.

1:72

Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors and has remembered his holy covenant,

1:73

the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham, to grant us 1.74

that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear,

1:75

in holiness and righteousness in his presence all our days. 1:76

And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,

1:77

to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.

1:78

Because of the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us,

1:79

to shine upon those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
